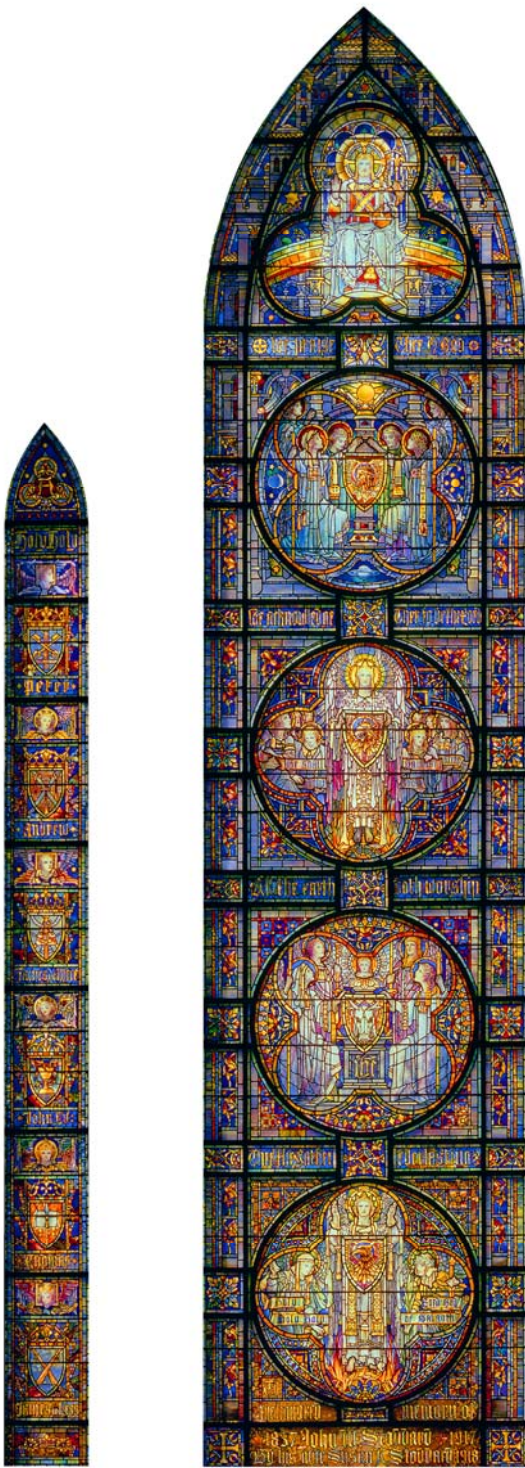



**Today's Music:** Hymn 457, "I Greet Thee, Who My Sure Redeemer Art," first appeared in the French Psalter published in Strasburg (1545) and has traditionally been ascribed to John Calvin (1509-1564), the leading theologian of the early Reformed theological tradition. His *Institutes of the Christian Religion* is one of the most important theological works ever written. Calvin was active in many dimensions of life in Geneva, where as a pastor, he preached, lectured, and wrote. His influence gave rise to Calvinism and the development of the Reformed faith throughout the world. Calvin was instrumental in the development of metrical psalmody.

Volunteers are also mentoring some of these individuals. The group will meet at the **Beavercreek YMCA** on the second and fourth Tuesdays from **7:30 to 8:30 p.m.** The group will operate as it has in the past, but in conjunction with the YMCA. We will offer childcare and YMCA scholarships for those who are interested in using the Y. ## EDUCATION

**Every Sunday, 9:15-9:45 a.m.**

- **Lectio Divina: Sunday Morning Meditation and Prayer** (Room 206) – This class experiences the ancient spiritual practice of "sacred reading" of the day's scriptures, seeking a personal word from God through the biblical text. Experienced class members lead the group.

**Today**

**11:20 a.m. - 12:15 p.m.**

- **Gospel Parables** (West Parlor) – Led by Sandy McConnel, this class will investigate one parable a week for six weeks. Participants will grow in appreciation and knowledge of Jesus' communication style and message.

- **Life and Thoughts of John Calvin** (203-205) – Led by Dr. David M. Whitford of United Theological Seminary. Somewhere along the way in school, most of us learned three things about John Calvin: 1) He ruled Geneva as a theocracy; 2) He burned Michael Servetus at the stake; and, 3) He believed in Predestination. Only one of these is really true. Come find out which one.

- **Listening for God in Classic American Literature** (Chapel) – Led by Dr. Robert Davis of Wittenberg University (Laurie Davis' husband), this course considers the meaning of the sacred in five American

writers: Frederick Douglass, Henry David Thoreau, Walt Whitman, Allen Ginsberg, and Annie Dillard. What these writers share is an interest in spiritual experiences that release people from the walled-in boundaries of an isolated self.

## INFANTS AND CHILDREN

**Infants and Young Toddlers** (birth - 2 years old) are cared for from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in Room 108. During the worship hour, the two-year olds are told a Bible story, participate in an activity, and enjoy a snack. Parents of infants are provided a beeper in case immediate communication is needed while they worship in the Sanctuary and attend Adult Education classes.

**Toddlers** (3 - 4 years old) are cared for from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in Room 102. During the worship hour they participate in a faith-formation class, "First Lessons in Faith," take part in an activity, and enjoy a snack.

**We welcome young children to worship in our Sanctuary.** We have prepared cloth worship bags with quiet, worship-related activities for pre-readers and early readers, including a children's bulletin for today's service. The bags can be found in a basket on a bench in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and upstairs in the balcony. All children are invited to use one throughout the worship time and then return the bag to its original location, taking the papers home with them. If you need help finding a bag, ask an usher for assistance.

**Pre-K and Kindergarteners** are invited to **Children and Worship**, a unique and interactive introduction to the stories and practices of our faith. As the second hymn begins, these children will be met in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and escorted to Room 106. Children and Worship concludes at 11:30 a.m. From there, children will be escorted to Genesis Singers (Pre-K) in Room 104 and Cherub Choir (K) in the Theater. Children not attending choir need to be met by their parents at 11:30 a.m.

Children in **grades 1 and 2** are invited to **Come and See**, a worship experience for younger elementary children. As the second hymn begins, these children will be met in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and escorted to Room 104. From there, they will be led by their shepherds to their CrossRoads workshops at 10:55 a.m.

**CrossRoads: Education for the Journey** features varied and engaging activities for children in **first through sixth grade**, 10:55-11:30 a.m. Today children continue the workshop, "Water, Come Down! Jesus' Baptism and Ours." As the final hymn begins, children are invited to meet their age-group shepherds in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and be escorted to their workshops. See signs in the west end of the Narthex and on the Fellowship Hall stage. Choir

children will be escorted directly to their rehearsals. Other children may be picked up from their workshops at 11:30 a.m.

**Calvin Fellowship** (grades 3-6) is going swimming today at the Vandalia Recreation Center. Following a light lunch at 12:15 p.m. in Fellowship Hall, we will ride the Westminster bus to Vandalia, returning by 3:30 p.m. Lunch \$1.00 and swimming \$4.00. Siblings and parents are welcome to join us.

**Taizé Service**  
**Thursday, February 2**  
**5:40-6:15 p.m., in the Sanctuary**

A meditative service of songs and prayers in candlelight.  
Everyone is welcome.

The liturgy for these services originated with the Taizé community founded in France in 1940. This community is an ecumenical, intentional community with a twofold purpose: to seek communion with God through personal prayer and the beauty of community prayer; and also be a leaven of peace and trust in the midst of humanity. A traditional Taizé service includes listening to God through simple, meditative songs, scripture, prayer and silence, in the beauty of the Westminster Sanctuary.

*Future Taizé services continue to be held the first Thursday  
of each month, and every Thursday during Lent.*

**Add your prayer to our new Prayer Wall**, located in the Sanctuary near the Chancel on the east wall. You will find blank prayer papers and pencils in the four mini-desks built into the wall. Write your prayer on the paper, roll up the paper, and insert it between the bricks of the wall. These prayers are completely private, between you and God. After the first Sunday of each month, the wall will be cleared and all prayer papers will be respectfully burned.

Prayer Wall postcards are now available to send to someone for whom you prayed. They are located in the Prayer Wall mini-desks and the Narthex.
