Today's Music: "The God of Abraham Praise" (Hymn 288) is an adaptation of the well-known Jewish hymn *Yigdal*, loosely translated and Christianized by the evangelist Thomas Olivers after a visit to the Great Synagogue of London in 1770. It was first published in 1772. The title of the hymn is based on a verse in the Book of Exodus: "I am the God of thy Father, the God of Abraham."

Some hymn writers such as Isaac Watts and Charles Wesley are remembered for many great hymns, but most writers are fortunate if only one hymn survives. "Spirit of God, Descend Upon My Heart" (Hymn 326) is the one surviving hymn of George Croly (1780-1860). It is based on Galatians 5:25 ("If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit"). Here is a very intense and personal prayer for God's Spirit to take over our life, purify it, and fill it with the pure love of angels. The last line is particularly appealing: "My heart an altar, and thy love the flame."

Over the years, Fanny Crosby may be the most popular and widely sung hymn author in America. Her "To God Be the Glory" became popular in England in the late 19th century, but did not become widely sung in America until it was included in the songbook for the Billy Graham Crusades.
