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



They also donated over \$500 to The Friends of The Castle in December. Most of the latter went towards presents for the clients and the rest started a line item in the budget for art supplies for The Castle. (The Castle is a gathering place of trust and friendship which supports people with mental illness and disorders to achieve their highest level of competence and independence. 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MEET DOMINIQUE MYERS -YOUR WPW CT SECRETARY

In 1985 Dominique, then an Air Force federal civil servant, relocated to the Dayton area in order to serve at Wright-Patterson AFB. Dominique served at Wright-Patterson AFB in a number of increasingly responsible contracting and acquisition program management positions in support of multiple systems acquisitions. After a very fulfilling 40-year career, she retired in 2012. Tom, however, continues to serve the USAF as the F-16 EPAF Systems Engineer.

Dominique and Tom have been married for 45 years and are the proud parents of two daughters, Jennifer and Lisa. Both daughters are now serving the USAF as federal civil servants. 

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MISSION: KIRKMONT CENTER

Kirkmont Camp was founded in 1963 by the Presbyterian Church USA primarily as a summer camp for children. Today Kirkmont Center is a non-profit organization that continues to offer summer camp with a Christian focus, but now also serves as an outdoor learning laboratory for public and private schools and as a year-round retreat facility and meeting space. One recent weekend had a church school retreat in one building, a boy scout troop in another, and a group of home-schooled teenagers in another. Weddings, Sunday church services, volunteers clearing trails, retreats for abused women, family reunions – all of these things and more happen at Kirkmont!



Kirkmont Center certainly functions as its sign says — "Welcome!

A place for all people in all seasons!"

Kirkmont is located in Logan County near Bellefontaine, Ohio. The 278-acre site is a beauty! It boasts a natural fen, two ponds,

cliffs, natural ravines, and pine groves. A family of pileated woodpeckers moved in last summer. There is a prayer trail, an outdoor labyrinth, sites for vespers, a swimming pool, and adventure challenges with low ropes, a zipline, and a giant swing.

Many Westminster children and adults have been to Kirkmont and have grown to love the atmosphere of the place – where all are welcome. Westminster Presbyterian Women has been among many in our Presbytery and in neighboring Presbyteries that have been faithful in their support of Kirkmont. That support has been critical to the continued existence of this unique place.



Many of you have heard or read the story, "Footprints in the Sand." Certainly Kirkmont is a place where these footprints in the snow are evidence of the many activities in which God walked with — and indeed carried — those in attendance here.
