Today's Music: Of his choral masterwork, *A German Requiem*, Johannes Brahms (1833-1897) wrote: "As for the title, I must admit I should like to leave out the word 'German' and refer instead to 'Humanity'." This comment points directly to the heart of his greatest choral composition. In contrast to the Latin Requiem Mass in the Roman Catholic liturgy with prayers for the dead ("Grant them eternal rest, O Lord"), *A German Requiem* focuses on the living, beginning with the text "Blessed are they that mourn, for they shall be comforted," from the Beatitudes. This theme—transition from anxiety to comfort—recurs throughout the work. Brahms took great pains putting together a message of hope for us all. Nestled in the middle of the work is the familiar and gorgeous chorus of tranquility, "How Lovely Is Thy Dwelling Place." Here is a message of hope and comfort.



Recently, scholars have argued for the importance of democratic practices and ideas for a proper understanding of early Christianity as a phenomenon. For example, Paul's choice of the term *ekklesia* as a designation for the groups he established in Greece and Asia Minor. For city dwellers in Paul's day, the term *ekklesia* would have denoted "the people's assembly." By using this term, did Paul intend to arouse in converts expectations of the freedom and equality associated with participation in this democratic institution? Was early Christianity a "spiritual democracy?" If so, how did the Christian movement become a more hierarchical institution? Come and explore the relevance of these questions for life in 2025.
