Today's Music: Paul Laurence Dunbar, author of the text to "When Storms Arise," was born June 17, 1872 in Dayton. He was the first African American poet to garner national critical acclaim. He penned a large body of dialect poems, standard English poems, essays, novels, and short stories, before he died at age 33. His work often addressed the difficulties encountered by members of his race and the efforts of African Americans to achieve equality in America. He was praised both by the prominent literary critics of his time and by his literary contemporaries.

The words for "O God Beyond All Praising" were written in 1982 by Michael Perry (1942-1996). The tune *Thaxted* comes from the middle section of the "Jupiter" movement in Gustav Holst's orchestral suite, *The Planets*. This tune is normally associated in the U.K. with the more patriotic text "I Vow to Thee My Country." Perry composed the text, he said, "in response to a call for alternative words that would be more appropriate for Christian worship."


